

## DEGREE PROGRESS EVALUATION

This degree progress evaluation has been prepared to assist you in planning your program of study by outlining your progress toward completion of general college requirements. We provide an updated evaluation every fall. Your major department and division evaluate progress toward major and division requirements.

"Units in Progress" reflects 1) courses in which you are currently enrolled, 2) courses with a grade of IN (incomplete), 3) year-long courses not yet completed and 4) courses for which you have registered in a future term. "To Be Met" indicates units required that are neither completed nor in progress. The formal declaration of major and changes in registration will affect the evaluation of your requirements.

### COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS

**QUANTITY:** The minimum credit required for graduation in a 4- or 5-year program is 30 units of academic work plus six quarters of PE. In exceptional cases, students may petition to graduate in 3 years with 27 units and six quarters of PE. Seniors must complete a minimum of six units in the thesis year.

**HUMANITIES:** Humanities 110 is required of all first-year students and of students who transfer with first-year standing, but without transfer credit equivalent to 110. Students who transfer as sophomores or juniors without transfer credit in humanities may take 110 or may take Humanities 210, 220 or 230, plus one additional unit from Group A or Group B. Courses used to fulfill the Humanities requirement may not be used to fulfill any other distribution requirement.

**PHYSICAL EDUCATION:** Students must complete 3 semesters (6 quarters) of PE. These should be completed in the first two years. Only one quarter of PE may be earned at a time.

**RESIDENCY:** A student must complete a minimum of two full years (15 units) of study at Reed College, including the senior or degree year. Courses taken at other institutions while at Reed do not count toward the 15 units.

### DISTRIBUTION (GROUP) REQUIREMENTS

1. Each group calls for two units in the same discipline.
2. No course may be used to satisfy more than one group requirement.
3. Independent study courses, AP or IB credit, and courses taken for credit/no credit may not be used to fulfill distribution requirements.
4. Only one of HUM 210, 220, or 230 may be used to satisfy group requirements.
5. Students subject to pre-fall 2005 requirements may not use courses in the major department to meet group requirements, except that interdisciplinary majors may use work in one of the departments of the combined major to fulfill one group requirement.
6. Students subject to requirements effective fall 2005 completing a single subject major may fulfill one of groups A-D with two units in the major department.
7. Students subject to requirements effective fall 2005 must complete two units in a single subject outside the major department(s) not already applied to a group requirement (Group X).

**Group A:** 2 units in the same discipline from: art history, classics (except language instruction and courses in history), dance (except applied), English, literature, music (except applied), philosophy, religion, theatre (excluding acting and design), or one of Humanities 210, 220, or 230. (History and History-Literature majors may not use Humanities to meet this requirement.)

**Group B:** 2 units in the same discipline from: The introductory course in anthropology, economics, political science or sociology and another course in the same discipline; or two units in the same discipline from history or psychology; Classics 371, 373, 375; one of Hum 210, Hum 220, or Hum 230; or two units in linguistics (from the approved list).

**Group C:** 2 units from either the biological sciences or the physical sciences (chemistry, physics) in courses that contain both lecture and laboratory components.

**Group D:** 2 units in the same discipline from either: (1) mathematics and formal or symbolic logic, or (2) foreign language (*not* foreign literature) or linguistics (see department listing in the catalog for specific courses).

**Group X:** In addition to groups A – D, students subject to requirements effective fall 2005 must complete 2 units in a single department outside the major department(s).

### DEPARTMENT AND DIVISION REQUIREMENTS

Your major department will and your division may have specific additional requirements. Many departments require a foreign language. Review the catalog and consult your adviser.

### TRANSFER CREDIT
